Privacy Notice (How we use school governor information)

The categories of governor information that we process include:

- personal identifiers, contacts and characteristics (such as name, date of birth, contact details and postcode)
- governance details (such as role, start and end dates and governor ID)

Why we collect and use governor information

The personal data collected is essential, in order for the school to fulfil their official functions and meet legal requirements.

We collect and use governor information, for the following purposes:

- a) to meet the statutory duties placed upon us
- b) to enable appropriate checks to be completed
- c) to enable governors to communicate with one another
- d) to inform relevant authorities of a governor appointments
- e) to undertake our responsibilities for safeguarding children
- f) to enable the school to contact governors

Our Legal Obligations

We must make sure that the information we collect and use about our governors is in line with the GDPR and Data Protection Act. This means that we must have a lawful reason to collect the data and that if we share that with another organisation or individual, we must have a legal basis to do so.

The lawful basis to collect information comes from a variety of sources such as:

- Articles 6 and 9 of the GDPR.
- Under S538 of the Education Act 1996, maintained schools have a legal duty to provide governance information.
- The Constitution of Governing Bodies of Maintained School Statutory Guidance, August 2017, stipulates that governor and associate member information is published on the website;(name,



category of governor, term of office, appointed by, any office held (e.g. chair, vice chair) summary of relevant business interest and attendance at meetings.

Collecting governor information

We collect personal information via governor contact forms.

Governor data is essential for the school's operational use. Whilst the majority of personal information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it may be requested on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with GDPR, we will inform you at the point of collection, whether you are required to provide certain information to us or if you have a choice in this.

Storing governor information

Who we share governor information with

We routinely share this information with:

- our local authority (where applicable)
- the Department for Education (DfE)
- Disclosure and Barring Service

Why we share governor information

We do not share information about our governors with anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Department for Education

The Department for Education (DfE) collects personal data from educational settings and local authorities. We are required to share information about our governors with the Department for Education (DfE) under S358 of the Education Act 1996

All data is entered manually on the GIAS system and held by DfE under a combination of software and hardware controls which meet the current [government security policy framework](#).

In case of an emergency of an Ofsted Inspection it is necessary for the school office to hold details of any individual involved in the governance of the school. The school Single central records will record that appropriate checks have been carried out for everyone involved in the school.



Disclosure and Barring Service

All maintained school governors are required to have an enhanced criminal records certificate from the DBS, Further details on DBS checks and S128 checks in schools are within the statutory guidance Keeping Children Safe in Education (KCS

Requesting access to your personal data

Under data protection legislation, you have the right to request access to information about you that we hold. To make a request for your personal information, contact SBM Services.

You also have the right:

- to ask us for access to information about you that we hold
- to have your personal data rectified, if it is inaccurate or incomplete
- to request the deletion or removal of personal data where there is no compelling reason for its continued processing
- to restrict our processing of your personal data (i.e. permitting its storage but no further processing)
- to object to direct marketing (including profiling) and processing for the purposes of scientific/historical research and statistics
- not to be subject to decisions based purely on automated processing where it produces a legal or similarly significant effect on you

If you have a concern or complaint about the way we are collecting or using your personal data, you should raise your concern with us in the first instance or directly to the Information Commissioner's Office at <https://ico.org.uk/concerns/>

How Government uses your data

The governor data that we lawfully share with the DfE via GIAS:

- will increase the transparency of governance arrangements
- will enable schools and the department to identify more quickly and accurately individuals who are involved in governance and who govern in more than one context
- allows the department to be able to uniquely identify an individual and in a small number of cases conduct checks to confirm their suitability for this important and influential role

Note: Some of these personal data items are not publically available and are encrypted within the GIAS system. Access is restricted to a small number of DfE staff who need to see it in order to fulfil their official duties. The information is for internal purposes only and not shared beyond the department, unless the law allows it.

How to find out what personal information DfE hold about you

Under the terms of the Data Protection Act 2018, you're entitled to ask the Department:

- if they are processing your personal data
- for a description of the data they hold about you
- the reasons they're holding it and any recipient it may be disclosed to
- for a copy of your personal data and any details of its source
