

Stock Church of England Primary School Sports Funding 2024 - 2025 £17,750

The government is providing additional funding to achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. Each school will receive £16,000 for the academic year plus a top-up of £10 per eligible pupil (5-11). This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in school. The following chart shows how we have allocated our funding to improve the provision of sport:
